AMERICAN EXPERIENCE "Mr. Polaroid"

Monday, May 19 at 8pm

Explore the life of the inventor of the Polaroid camera, Edwin Land, and one of the most visionary and prolific inventors of the 20th century. At the time of his death in 1991, Land held 535 patents (a number only surpassed by Thomas Edison and Elihu Thomson).
